Just in case you do not have the ARL codes handy, here are the translations of the ARL codes that were used in this message.

Translation:

ARL FIFTY – Greeting by Amateur Radio

ARL FIFTY SIX – Congratulations on your new call sign

ARL SIXTY NINE – Welcome to the Amateur Radio World. We are glad to have you with us and hope you will enjoy the fun and fellowship of the organization.

The handling instruction is HXC. Translation, please provide time and date of message delivery back to W1GMF via amateur radio. We can send the information back to Gil via the ATEN net.

So, to deliver the message, all you need to do is call the individual and read the message substituting the translation for the ARL code. For example, "Hello, is this Brad Richardson? My name is Bob Hollister and I am a member of the Cochise Amateur Radio Association. My callsign is N7INK and I have an Amateur Radio Message for you from a fellow ham. Here is the message: Greeting by Amateur Radio, Congratulations on your new callsign. Welcome to the Amateur Radio World. We are glad to have you with us and hope you will enjoy the fun and fellowship of the organization. Signed, Gil W1GMF. End of message.

I would also like to offer you an invitation to attend one of our club meetings at 7 PM on the first Monday of each month at our club site on Moson road. If there is anything I or the club can do to help you as you get more involved with amateur radio let me know. Any questions?
