We will be deploying the MCU from Green Acres at approximately 1800 and setting up some displays showing different aspects of amateur radio. Dale has a plan developed for this event. 3) Bisbee Coaster Race - Just a reminder to put this down on your calendar. It is on a Sunday morning this year. Please sign up with RB Rice or myself. We still have approximately five (5) assignments to fill.

Training — Incident Action Plans – On our last couple nets we briefly discussed Incident Action Plans or IAPs. As short recap, the Incident Action Plan (IAP) formally documents incident goals (known as control objectives in the National Incident Management System (NIMS)), operational period objectives, and the response strategy defined by incident command during response planning. On our last net we covered the ICS 205. Tonight I have prepared an ICS 202, IAP. This is the base document for the IAP and is prepared as an example for a pre-planned event. The event covered is the JROTC training scheduled for next Tuesday evening. For a non-planned event such as a SAR mission or Evacuation Support mission the objectives would probably describe specific ground areas to cover, or housing areas to cover and geographic information to support the mission. For a Wild Fire example, it might describe the areas to be

contained as the fire progresses. The IAP would also be updated for each successive operational period and reflect necessary changes as the situation changes.

That's it for tonight's training. If you have any questions, please ask them during comments.
