
Paul Ulysses Bottine, W3ABN

Born to Lelani and Vern Early, on April 23, 1969 in Waterloo, Iowa, Paul joined the Military Service in July of 1987 from the West Des Moines, MEPPS Station, and was stationed at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, where he was a U.S. Army Paratrooper assigned to the 82nd Airborne Division until medically released from service in

April of 1998. He was a 75F20 Information's Systems Management Specialist and left the Army a Non-Commissioned Officer, Gulf War Veteran, and proud American patriot.
